## LIS SUMMARY AS INTRODUCED - HB2782 (Simonds)

**Board of Wildlife Resources; creel limits; blue catfish.** Requires the Board of Wildlife Resources to amend regulations to remove the one-fish daily limit for blue catfish longer than 32 inches in the tidal waters of the James, Rappahannock, and York Rivers and their tributaries below the fall line.

## LIS SUMMARY AS PASSED (FINAL AMENDMENTS) – HB2782 (Simonds)

**Board of Wildlife Resources; creel limits; blue catfish.** Requires the Board of Wildlife Resources to amend regulations to remove the one-fish daily limit for blue catfish longer than 32 inches in the Commonwealth.

## GOVERNOR'S VETO (HB2782 - Simonds)

Pursuant to Article V, Section 6 of the Constitution of Virginia, I veto House Bill 2782, which amends regulations to allow anglers to keep unlimited numbers of blue catfish larger than 32" statewide.

Although there are concerns about the overpopulation of blue catfish in the Chesapeake Bay and its associated waterways, requiring the Department of Wildlife Resources to amend their regulations related to catfish statewide does not consider the vibrant recreational fisheries and associated economic benefits. Reviewing the benefit for recreational fisherman, as well as the possible negative impact of the species, should be at the discretion of the Department of Wildlife Resources.

Accordingly, I veto this bill.

Reviewing the benefit for recreational fisherman, as well as the possible negative impact of the species, should be at the discretion of the Department of Wildlife Resources.

Accordingly, I veto this bill.

# **Health advisories**

Rappahannock - I-95 bridge downstream, less than or equal to 2 meals/month,

**York River – Pamunkey** – upstream 72 miles from confluence with Mattoponi, less than or equal to 2 meals/month

James – downstream of fall line – No consumption for fish greater 32"

James – downstream of fall line – less than or equal to 2 meals/month < 32"

As general rule, larger fish have more contaminants

### **Creel Limits**

All tidal rivers – 2006 was when only 1>32" went into effect

Rappahannock was removed effective January 1, 2017 – found no large fish in samples


Rappahannock added back on January 1, 2021 – anglers reported large fish in catches

Regulation for Kerr and Gaston modified for consistency with North Carolina circa 2019


### **MRC Commercial Fishery**

Generally fish pots and nets, limited electrofishing – three permits. Landings higher than striped bass, value much lower.

## **Environmental Community**

The environmental community is concerned about the impacts of blue catfish to other resources in the Chesapeake Bay. Blue catfish are very abundant and diet studies indicate that they eat a lot of different things. Concern in particular focuses on blue crab, striped bass, and Atlantic menhaden. Removal of blue catfish is viewed as steps towards improving the populations of economically and ecologically important species in the Bay. However, Hilling et al. estimated that blue catfish predation on blue crabs in the James was equivalent to 4.2% of statewide commercial harvest, striped bass were infrequently consumed, and that predation on menhaden was a fraction of the hundreds of thousands of metric tonnes caught by commercial fishermen.


